There's never a dull moment in the personal or professional lives of the staff of Chicago County Hospital's emergency room as the first decade of this popular series draws to an end. As Drs. Carter (Noah Wyle) and Kovac (Goran Visnjic) return from their work in war-torn Congo, a nervous new med student (Parminder Nagra) joins the staff and Dr. Lewis (Sherry Stringfield) enters into a friendship with a suicidal architect (Bob Newhart). Family Ties 5th Season Michael J. Fox catapulted into superstardom--and created one of the most beloved television characters of all time--in the 1980s sitcom *Family Ties*. Created by TV impresario Gary David Goldberg, the series offered a clever take on the generation gap through the family interactions of two former '60s hippies, public-television producer Steven Keaton (Michael Gross) and his architect wife, Elyse (Meredith Baxter). Together, they struggle to retain their leftist ideals while raising three radically divergent children in suburban Columbus, Ohio: tomboy Jennifer (Tina Yothers); ditzy mallrat Mallory (Justine Bateman); and, most notably, Wall Street Journal-reading young Republican Alex P. Keaton (Fox), who served as the series' main comedic foil. A fun and warmhearted throwback to the greed-is-good decade. In highlights from this season, Steven considers reestablishing a left-wing paper he worked before he became a family man; Nick and Mallory cause a stir when it's revealed that they plan to elope; and Uncle Rob arrives with bad news. Caroline in the City 2nd Season Lea Thompson plays Caroline Duffy, a successful comic-strip writer who models her toons on her life as a single woman in Manhattan. Through the ups and down she's always able to count on her witty friend, Richard (Malcolm Gets), an aspiring painter who works his days filling in the inked panels at Caroline's apartment. It's there that much of the series' sexual tension simmers, allowing for more than a few of the sitcom's love triangles and season-ending cliffhangers. Though their pent-up affections are kept undercover, they're readily apparent to Annie (Amy Pietz), Caroline's free-spirited best friend and Richard's occasional nemesis. Lea Thompson returns for a sophomore season of this popular 1990s sitcom, starring as Caroline Duffy, a Manhattan-based cartoonist with a messy personal life and wacky friends, including sometimes boyfriend Del (Eric Lutes) and her adoring colorist, Richard (Malcolm Gets). In highlights from this season, Caroline's cat, Salty, has a calamitous bout with a pet therapist, and Del and Charlie get trapped in a snow-covered car. 7th Heaven The 8th Season The heartwarming television dramedy *7th Heaven* blends sometimes outlandishly comic situations with dramatic plotlines about serious social issues into a positive affirmation of family values and Christian morality. Produced by Aaron Spelling, the series centers on an all-American family headed by Reverend Eric Camden (Stephen Collins) and his stay-at-home wife, Annie (Catherine Hicks), as they struggle with the daily stresses and joys of parenting. Meanwhile, the Camdens' seven children--among them Lucy (Beverley Mitchell), Simon (David Gallagher), youngest daughter Ruthie (Mackenzie Rosman), and twins Sam and David (real-life twins Lorenzo and Nikolas Brino)--navigate the trials and tribulations of growing up with wholesome aplomb. Trouble comes to Glen Oak in this family drama's eighth year. As newlyweds Lucy (Beverley Mitchell) and Kevin (George Stults) struggle through their first year of marriage, the Camdens cope with the fallout from Mary's secret wedding and Simon's car accident. Meanwhile, the friendship between Ruthie (Mackenzie Rosman) and Peter is tested when his long-lost father shows up, and a stranger (Tyler Hoechlin) insinuates himself into the Camden family.
